Training in Classical Jujutsu and Buki no waza

Shindo Yoshin ryu is a Koryu Bujutsu (Classical Japanese Martial Art) founded in the 1800s by renowned samurai of the Kuroda clan and retainer, Matsuoka Katsunosuke. TSYR is considered a comprehensive martial tradition including Jujutsu (unarmed grappling), Buki no waza (Weapon techniques), Ura no waza (Principles and Concepts) as well as Heiho no waza (Strategies and Tactics). It is a system of rich heritage and philosophical depth, that is practiced to this day in a classical approach and mindset.

Jujutsu (unarmed grappling) • Kogusoku (grappling in light armor) • Katchu (Armor)
Kenjutsu (fencing) • Tantojutsu (knife work) • Tetsubo (iron truncheon)
Kogai (utility tool) • Torinawa (capturing with flexible items).
